Date: November 2022 Review Date: November 2025 At Albrighton Primary School and Nursery, we believe that wearing school uniform instils a sense of identity and pride. It also demonstrates to visitors to school that we have an ethos of high expectations and standards.

School Uniform

Boy's Uniform:

Grey trousers or shorts; pale blue shirt (short or long sleeved); navy blue sweatshirt or jumper, black shoes; grey, black, navy or white socks.

Girl's Uniform:

Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts; pale blue blouse (short or long sleeved); navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan; black, navy or white socks or tights, black or navy shoes; blue gingham dress for Summer; white socks or navy socks; black, navy or white plain, low heeled sandals.

Pale blue polo shirts and navy sweatshirts or cardigans – all with the school logo, can be purchased from the school office.

Please note fashion shoes or boots are not permitted. Boots are not part of school uniform, however, it is quite acceptable for your child to wear boots or wellies to school in inclement weather and then change into their school shoes when they arrive at school. Children will then be able to put their boots back on at the end of the school day to walk home.

Trainers are only permitted for outdoor PE.

PE Kit

Outdoors

Navy blue joggers (can be shorts in warm weather) plain white t-shirt, navy blue sweatshirt (can be school uniform one) and black/navy/grey/white trainers (these should be as plain as possible).

Indoors

Navy blue shorts, plain white t-shirt, black plimsolls and a pump bag (ones with school logo are available for purchase).

Additional Information

Can we please remind you to make sure that all school uniform and PE kit is labelled with your child's name. This helps to prevent clothes getting lost and children upset.

Jewellery:

The only permitted jewellery is a wrist watch and a small, plain, metal stud earring which must be removed for PE and swimming days.
